The designer also is a fan of using wood moldings and trim to create visual interest or to mimic the look of a finished paneled wall.

"Add visual interest with vertical board and batten," she recommends. "This look turns a rather bland wall into a charming, dimensional finished treatment." Additionally, she suggests adding wood to the ceiling. "Highlight your ceiling by adding tongue-and-groove cladding painted crisp white; to help draw your eye to this textured ceiling, add stained beams that wrap the room and run across the textured tongue-and-groove ceiling."

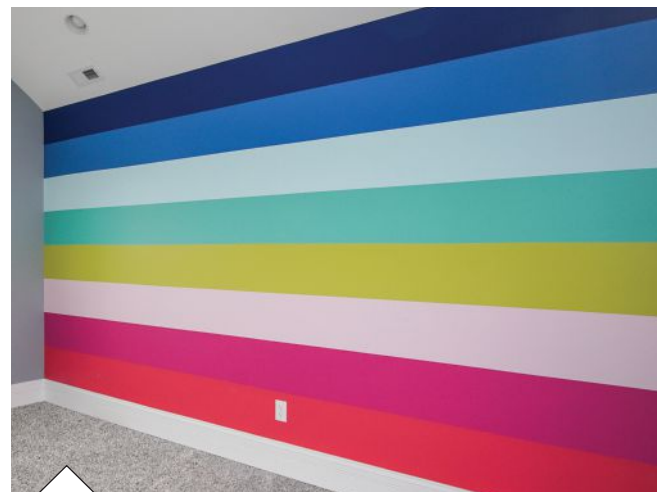
## Finish Lines
